The District 4 Sallie Southall Cotten Scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding senior high school student (male or female) nominated by a local GFWC-NC club in the district. Both the winner and runner-up will receive a onetime scholarship payment to the North Carolina college or university they will be attending. GFWC-NC LEADS

The GFWC-NC LEADS program is a training seminar which builds on GFWC's goal of developing future leaders.

The Leadership, Education, and Development Seminar identifies members at the local level who have the potential and desire to assume leadership positions. Participation in LEADS can help up-and-coming leaders gain the capabilities, confidence, and commitment necessary to pursue and achieve higher offices and serve with distinction.

Each district sponsors one member to represent them annually at the GFWC-NC LEADS session, typically held in January. They receive a complimentary dinner, and one-half night's accommodations, breakfast, and lunch at a designated hotel. District LEADS candidates will be given the opportunity to learn about GFWC, as well as receive specialized leadership training to share with her district and club. From the GFWC-NC session, one district LEADS representative will be chosen to represent North Carolina as the LEADS candidate and attend the GFWC LEADS train-

ing at the GFWC Annual Convention

Club Spotlight: GFWC Northwest Guilford Woman's Club

In recognition of September 11th, Northwest Guilford Woman's Club prepared baskets of snacks and games like Sudoku, crossword puzzles, etc. for first responders in their area.

Volunteering with local veterans is a major focus of this club. Members are very involved with <u>Triad Honor Flight</u>, which flies veterans to Washington, DC to experience memorials dedicated to their service. Club members donate food items and provide decorations at the airport. They provide their presence during the flight's send off and welcome the veterans back to the airport. Some Northwest Guilford club members also act as guardians and bus captains during the flight. They are assigned to a Vet and stay with them throughout the day-long trip, assisting them when needed.







On Veteran's Day they will assist with TWO ceremonies in their area handing out flags, water and expressions of gratitude to those who served.

Other upcoming projects for this active club include: A trash pick-up on a local highway; Cooking and serving chili and desserts to guests of Greensboro Urban Ministry one day each year; Support of the Summerfield Christmas Store which provides a Christmas shopping experience for parents in need, where members provide gifts and volunteer in the store.

Club Spotlight: Woman's Club of Southwest Guilford

The Woman's Club of Southwest Guilford recently held their September meeting with the Civic Engagement CSP presenting a program on the topic of Dementia. Rona Klein, community engagement speaker for the Alzheimer's Association, spoke on Effective Communications with a person with dementia. After the presentation, members took prepared materials and hand sewed buttons and pinned items onto Fidget Blankets for sewing. Fidget Blankets are designed with many different textures and moving parts to keep a person with dementia busy. Zippers, pockets, buttons, pieces to tie or untie or Velcro to attach and reattach. Members will meet later to finish the blankets with sewing machines.









Club members are meeting on October 6th to hike the Cascade Preserve Loop in Oakridge. They will be met by Martha Pittman, MST Council member and Anne Steele, Oakridge MST co-chair to talk about the history and current challenges as they continue to develop the trail. The ladies plan to dine at Bistro 150 after the hike and maybe even stop in at the Historic Old Mill for fresh ground grains and local homemade products.



The Woman's Club of Southwest Guilford will be selling Raffle tickets for the pictured fire pit and accessories/enhancements (totaling over \$350). Tickets are \$5.00 for 1, \$10 for 3 and \$20 for 10. The drawing will be held October 3, just in time for a great fall outdoor gathering.

The proceeds of this raffle are in turn donated back into their community. They have donated over \$32,000 since 2013 when the club was established.

They are proud to offer two college scholarships – one for an academically gifted female senior and a community college scholarship for a male/female deserving high school senior.
